Áine is a qualified Architectural Design Technologist BA & started teaching part time in CDETБ (2005) night school.

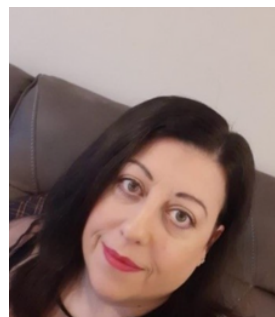
